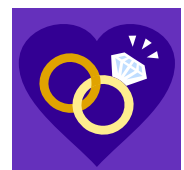

Screw Salad

20 oz mixed vegetables
 1 cup chopped celery
 1 cup green pepper
 1 1/2 cups white vinegar
 1 tsp prepared mustard

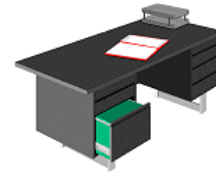
1 1/2 cups rotini noodles
 1 cup chopped onion
 1 1/2 cups sugar
 1/4 cup oil
 Dash of salt

Cook vegetables until tender. Drain and cool. Add celery, onion and green pepper. Set aside. In a small bowl, mix together sugar, white vinegar, oil, mustard and salt. Cook and drain noodles. Mix everything together and marinate 12 hours. Can be kept in refrigerator for 1 month.

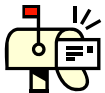
